The year 'after the pandemic' was full of activities and brought some big changes for our organisation.

We are very proud of our annual **South West Multicultural Festival** held on 18th February 2023, managed by Jo O'Dea and her team and overseen by the Management committee. It was a delight to see all the different cultural groups performing and participating in our flag parade, workshops or dancing the night away during the concert. The joy and fun it brought to the community was simply beautiful! Our festival is on the way to a multi-day event with activities in the lead up and new partnerships with other groups, organisations and artists.

We took our **Dine with Me** events to a next level when we introduced international food delights to our friends from the South Bunbury Rotary Club (more than 60 guests) accompanied by cultural performances from Spain and India. Two more events were hosted in January (as a picnic) and in August (with an international music quiz night) – a fantastic opportunity to bring people together and share food and stories.

Our project **Driving to make a Difference** in partnership with the Multicultural Services Centre WA is very popular and needed. This project gives CaLD women the opportunity to receive free driving lessons to assist with getting their licence. This year we have been fortunate to again receiving funding from the City of Bunbury and the Office of Multicultural Interests. Simcoa Operations sponsored this very important project as well and we were able to support 17 women with 5 free driving lessons per person with a professional driving instructor and help to prepare for the Practical Driving Assessment and, eventually, the WA license! Our long term project coordinator Cherie Musitano handed over to our new coordinator Jo O'Dea who puts a lot of effort into promoting the initiative and partnering with new sponsors to further extend the project. This one Thing - our photo and audio exhibition- celebrates the stories and cultural identities of 16 people (who have found a new home in the South West) holding the one precious item they could never have left behind when they left their country of origin. It was on display at the Bunbury Forum Shopping Centre and the Dardanup Town Hall in partnership with the Shire of Dardanup. The visitors had the opportunity to experience the stories and cultural identities of the 16 migrants first hand; both combined with a **This is Me** panel discussion (as a breakfast and a dinner) where our storytellers shared their migration experiences with us and how they settled in the South West and visitors could ask questions. Thank you to Christin Svard, Nyanyul Aguer, Vimbai Madondo, Shizleen Aishat and Rachel Fernandez for letting us experience their culture and journey. A special Thank You goes to Dominique Bayens who was our wonderful, empathic host.

Thank you to Ash Hastie from the Bunbury Forum and Sam Atkinson from the Shire of Dardanup for developing the marketing material, the promotion of the event and providing the delicious catering.

Stories are the heart of what we do and who we are. They strengthen connections between people and encourage a more inclusive and informed community. In cooperation with the Centre of Stories in Perth and the Bunbury Museum & Heritage Centre the Backstories Bunbury event was created and our two committee members Widi Astuti and Shizleen Aishat gave the audience an insight into their lives and passions.

The Bunbury Multicultural Group was nominated for an award at the WA Multicultural Awards ceremony by the City of Bunbury. The awards recognise individuals and organisations for their outstanding contributions to multiculturalism and culturally and linguistically diverse (CaLD) communities in Western Australia. A huge honour!

This year we were again consulted by media, organisations and government to present information and offer comment to provide a multicultural perspective for various projects in our region. We shared our experiences with the medical system from a migrant perspective with e.g. the Bunbury Hospital or WA Country Health Service SW, Regional Consumer and Carer Engagement Network, we promoted multicultural activities of all organisations in Bunbury Geographe and built new relationships with other groups and local businesses.



There is currently no other organisation in Bunbury Geographe that brings together the diversity of cultural groups to showcase their culture and to educate the community as does Bunbury Multicultural group. Our reputation and expertise led to the biggest transformation of our small group since the establishment in 1991. We were approached by OMI to apply for the Community Support Grant and formalise our work as an umbrella organisation in Bunbury Geographe.

The application was successful and due to the funding we were able to contract a project coordinator to address the needs of people from a CaLD background in our region. The funding allows us to properly expand and further establish activities, services and events for the benefit of the CaLD community in Bunbury Geographe.

The year ahead will bring some new tasks and initiatives, and we will continue delivering our vision of promoting multiculturalism, understanding and friendship in our community.
